Veterans knocking in vain at college doors may find some opening as the result of a survey of over 1,500 colleges to be conducted in March by the Veterans Administration in cooperation with educational agencies.

Findings of the survey indicating available college facilities are expected to be made known at the Veterans Administration regional offices in time for summer and fall enrollments.

A new twist to the problem of the veteran and his former civilian job comes out of the Middlefield, Ohio, concern that just could not afford for the sake of good business to get rid of the employee who had replaced a serviceman. The company made a deal with the vet, paying him in lieu of his old job the sum of \$8,000--his peak earnings before he entered the Navy.

More than a million veterans have found jobs sealed and are drawing \$20 a week unemployment compensation. Readjustment allowances paid for the week ending 9 February totaled \$25,581,000. The number of recipients increased from 963,000 to 1,036,000.

SPORTS PASTIME

International athletics got a shot in the arm with the announcement that Olympic Games will be resumed in London in 1948, first since 1936. Chief headache of the of the International Olympic Committee is the invitation list.

Lord Aburdale, executive member of the committee, extends a welcome to "athletes from all parts of the world," while another official said that Germany and Japan "certainly won't be invited." Another tacklish problem is the eligibility of subsidized Russian players.

The United States will set up a committee this summer to name players and teams for the games. W.N. Greim, president of the National Amateur Athletic Union, expect returning servicemen and expanded peacetime sports activities to strengthen this country's chances in foreign competition.

Britain's present "austerity" program probably rules out construction of a special stadium for the events and it appears now that the games will be divided between two arenas already in existence--Wembley Stadium and White City.

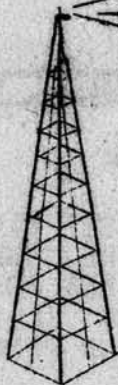

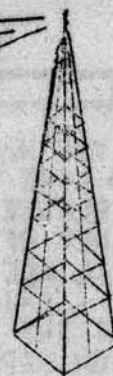

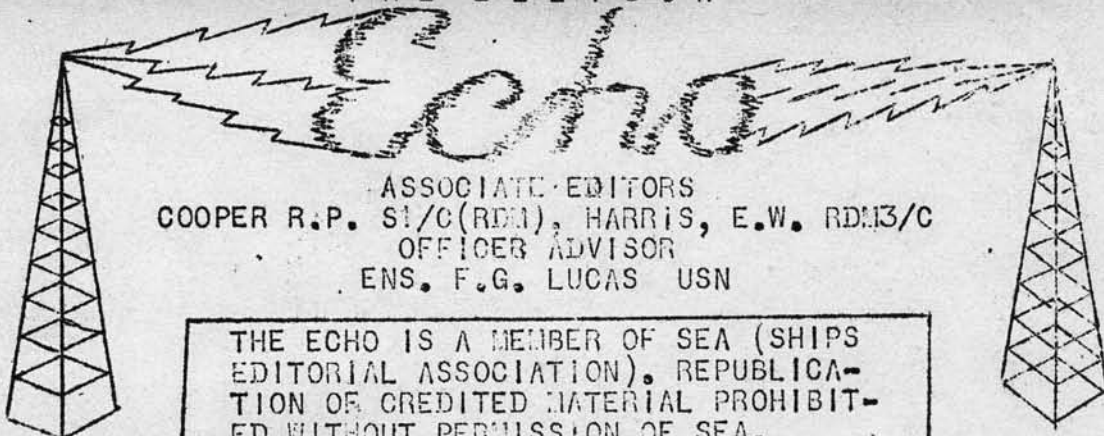
